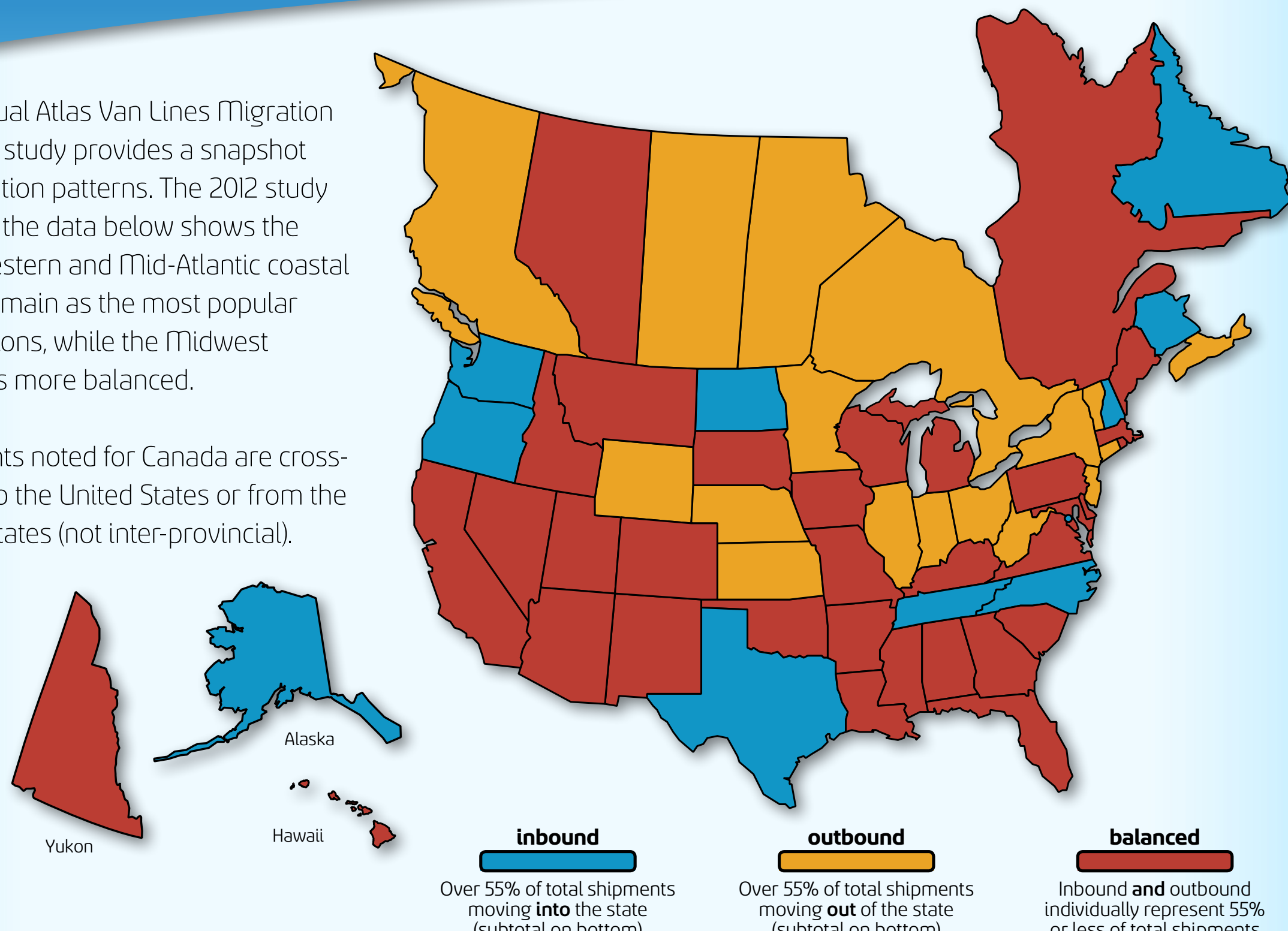


The annual Atlas Van Lines Migration Patterns study provides a snapshot of relocation patterns. The 2012 study used for the data below shows the Southwestern and Mid-Atlantic coastal states remain as the most popular destinations, while the Midwest becomes more balanced.

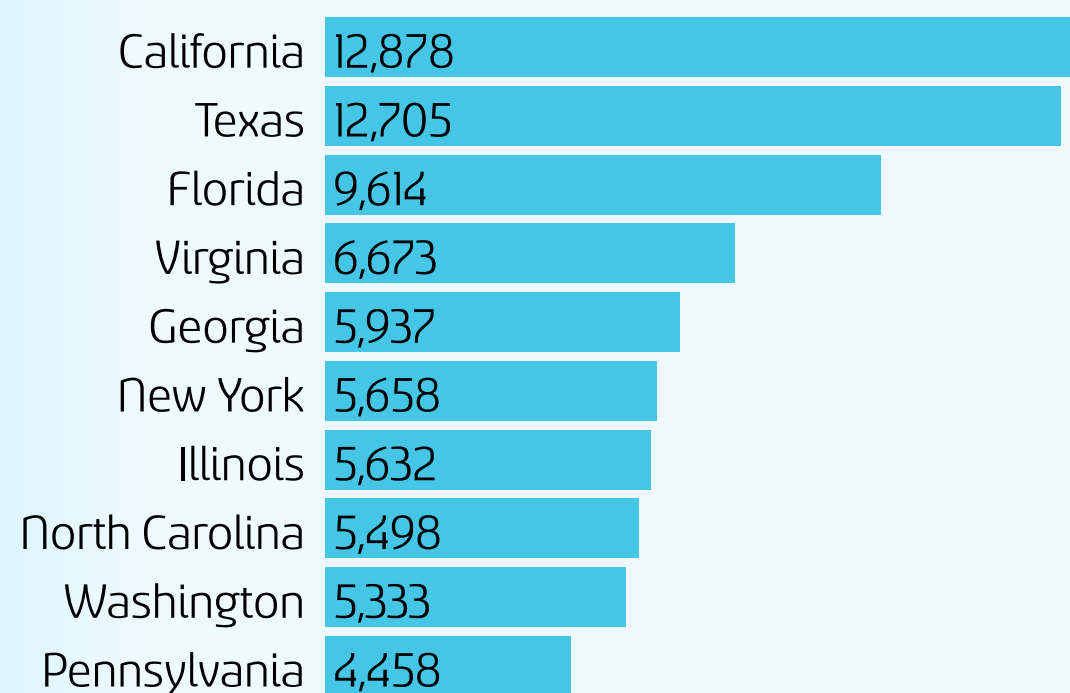

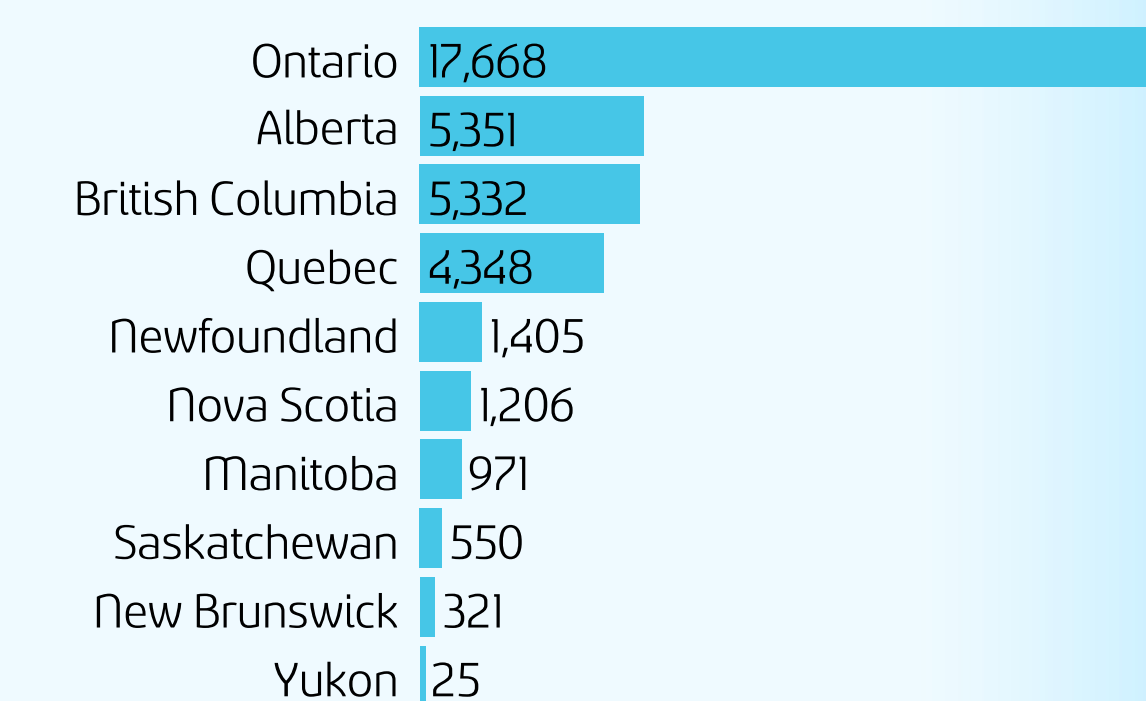

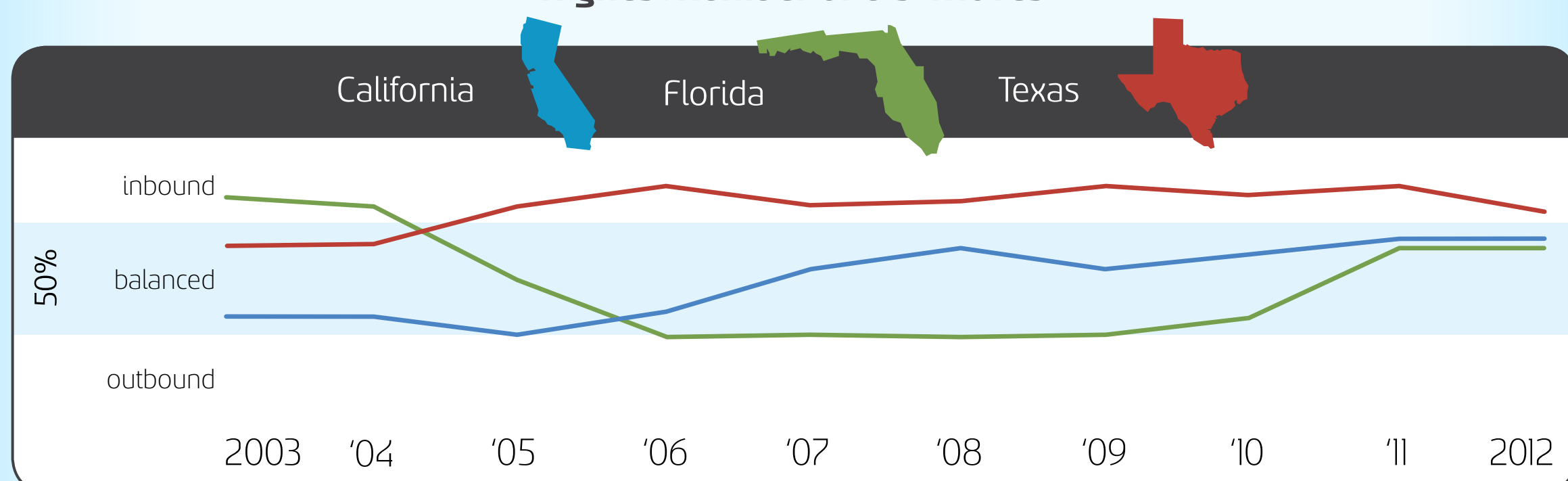

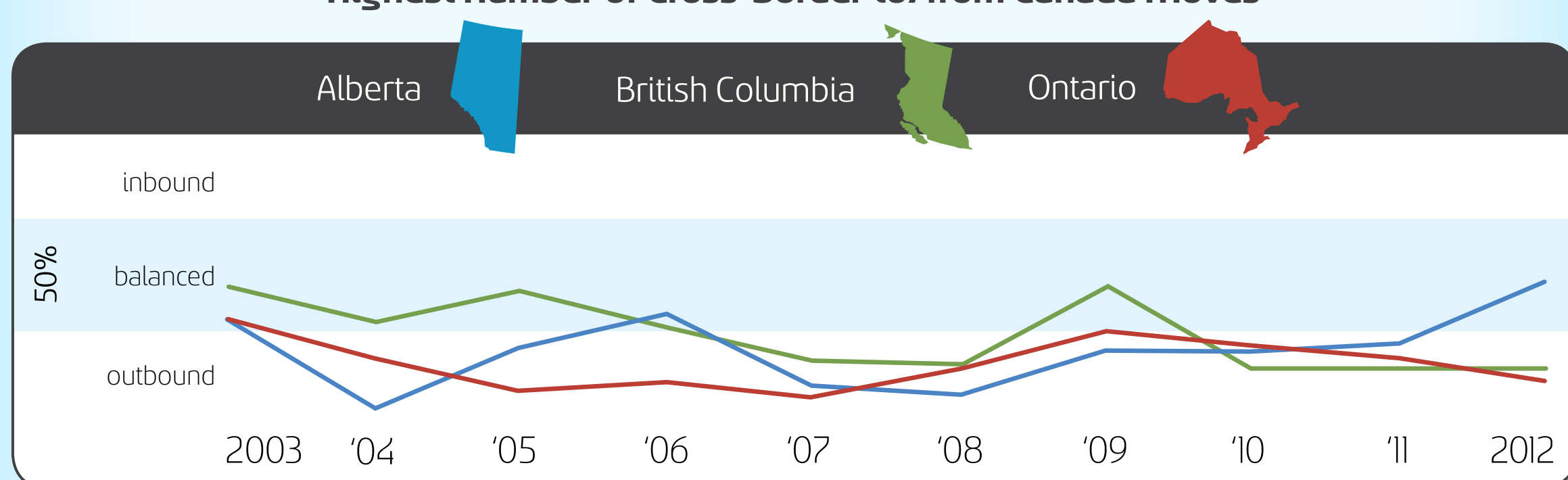
